Organised by ICEX Spain and the Spanish Embassy in Singapore, this year’s edition will take place from 15 September to 15 October and will see a slew of gastronomic events planned for that period. Building on the momentum from last year, this year’s initiative will include an array of experiences running from various wine dinners and special tastings to cooking shows and culinary demonstrations, held in collaboration with various food and beverage partners in Singapore.

Probably the biggest news as part of “Eat Spain Drink Spain” is the addition of two Singapore-based Spanish-themed restaurants to the **vaunted Restaurants from Spain list**. This year sees both outlets of My Little Spanish Place – at Boat Quay and Coronation Plaza – join the 16 other restaurants flying high Spain’s culinary flag.
